


Cervical Cancer Screening PDSA Review:

- Heartland and PrairieStar staff submitted Cervical Cancer Screening PDSAs after the November meeting.
- Data from DRVS shows improvement in the measure over the past two months for all health centers using DRVS (slide 4).
- Amy Lurken, Heartland, commented that using the DRVS Measure Analyzer (sample shown at right) made a significant difference in their ability to quickly understand the effect of changes to processes.



American Cancer Society Guidelines and Early Detection:

- Dan Leong, Health Systems Manager for the American Cancer Society in Kansas, provided an overview of the ACS’ efforts to increase screening for colorectal cancer. The ACS goal in 1996 was to reduce age-adjusted cancer mortality by 50%. The ACS plans to update that goal.

- Susan Wood, Director of Clinical and Quality Programs at KAMU, shared information about the 80% by 2018 project during which KAMU collaborated with KDHE and the ACS to assist Health Partnership with the implementation of processes designed to improve colorectal cancer screening rates.

Connections Quality Forum Measures and Goals:

- The Measures and Targets chart (slide 7) now show the same goal and color scheme as the [Quality Forum Awards](#) program.
- Because not all health centers have reported performance via SurveyMonkey, only current performance from DRVS is listed in the chart on slide 8. It is important to note that the DRVS data shown for health centers who are still in the early stages of production will fluctuate as health centers fine-tune mapping and validate data.
- Terri created the Quality Forum Measures custom dashboard in DRVS. This dashboard is available to all Connections members using DRVS (click Dashboards, then Custom Dashboards).

Terri Kennedy (to Everyone): 11:44 AM: I did a check on KMAP for colonoscopy payments. It

looks like KanCare will pay the PPS rate for colonoscopies performed by a physician in the health center. I'm guessing no one does that, right?!

Amy Lurken (to Everyone): 11:49 AM: Correct. No capacity for that in our center. They go to LMH and we have an interface, luckily... but there are still so many psychosocial barriers

Terri Kennedy (to Everyone): 11:52 AM: KanCare will also pay a max fee of \$293.17 for a colonoscopy performed by a gastroenterologist specialist accepting Medicaid patients.

- Question from Chat: Do they do competitions and prizes for all UDS quality measures at the same time? How long do they run (ongoing vs certain amt of months)?
- Response from Mona: “Competitions and prizes are different for each team assigned a quality measure. Each team has a far different approach to their measure. Some teams hand out monthly items to other teams such as a bracelet with elephants on it; “Don’t forget to take a second B/P reading”, pink prizes for mammos, a digital scale for the best improvement for Adult BMI measure, the Starfish Award (Everyone Counts) for the Depression Measure, etc. Each team is assigned a measure for the entire year then a new one in January. It gives fresh thought to strategies for the measure. By presenting to their peers each month in a short 5 minute presentation, discussion takes place on what is working and what is not. The point is getting everyone involved and keeping them that way.”

PDSA Cycle Planning and Member Report Back: Challenges discussed are racial/ethnic disparities and customs.

Tools in DRVS to Manage and Improve Cervical Cancer Screening: Heather reviewed tools to aid improvement efforts. Refer to slides 38-46 for examples of the Patient Visit Planning report (PVP), Dashboards, Scorecards, Measure Analyzer, and Registries.

Amy reported that using the PVP (samples shown at right) has been very successful for improvement in their PAP measure. They use “opt out language and the PVP to just plan to do the pap (or have the FOBT kit in the room to talk to the patient)”. Sample PVP reports follow.
